If you find that a sound is very uncomfortable for the child, or you know beforehand that it will be, please skip it or move on quickly.





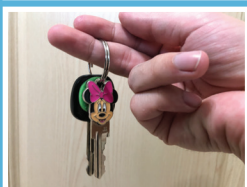
WHAT TO FIND



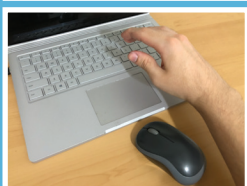
Shake the change jar or just shake some change in your hand. What do you hear?

Have a parent help you get a cup of ice, put your ear up close, and listen as they pour water into it.



Jump on the bed (not too high or hard) and listen to the sounds it makes.



Open up a window in your house, close your eyes, and listen to all the sounds coming from outside for 1 minute – it's okay if you can't listen for a whole minute. What do you hear while listening at the window – birds, trees blowing, traffic?
